Parish Council Round Up - August - October 2023

Planning & Development

In the summer months the Parish Council received a very large amount of public engagement regarding the proposal to build 20 dwellings on Church Lane. At the June meeting over 70 members of the public attended to raise concerns about the proposal and over 100 more people had written individually to ERYC Planning Department raising their concerns about the proposed development. In response to resident's concerns the Parish Council voted to oppose the development, enlisting support of Ward Councillors to ensure that resident's views were represented when the proposal was considered by the ERYC Planning Committee. The Parish Council was subsequently informed that the proposal had been withdrawn.

Other developments including those in Chapel Lane, Mt Airey and Strawberry Fields are progressing. Up to the time of the October meeting of the parish Council there were no new planning proposals to consider within the Parish boundary and only one at Paull with a link to Keyingham as it aims to assist with reducing flooding on farmland by taking excess water from Keyingham Drain at its outfall into the Humber.

Road Safety in Keyingham

Despite the help and support of our Ward Councillors progress towards the work to redesign the road crossing at the centre of the village appears to be stalled. Cllr Sean McMaster provided a written update to the Parish Council at the October meeting, highlighting the responses he received from the Highways Dept which appear to indicate that there are significant issues with the proposed design of

the changes to the road crossing. The parish Council has made a formal response expressing profound disappointment at the lack of progress and requesting a clear response to its questions regarding the resolution of this issue.

Antisocial Behaviour on the Village Green/CCTV

At the June meeting the Council received confirmation from ERYC that the installation of CCTV in the area if the Village Green, Saltaugh Road Amenity Area and Main Street would begin late August and should be complete by mid- September. In October the Parish Council were informed that due to the high uptake of this funding opportunity throughout the East Riding the installation team were behind schedule but reassured us that the Cameras would be installed as soon as possible.

Keyingham Village Hall

The Parish Council continues to support the efforts of the Village Hall Committee to stimulate use and engagement for the Village Hall.

Utilising the grant funding which the Parish Council received it has been possible to update the heating system, make some essential repairs repaint the exterior and hold a further programme of film shows. Wednesday Coffee Mornings continue to draw huge crowds for the amazing cakes and cheery service, and the afternoon Tea on 20th October was very well attended despite the awful weather. At the October meeting of the Parish Council the Council pledged funds form the 'Youth Welfare' budget to support children's Christmas celebrations on

16th December. These will include a visit from Father Christmas and a special showing of the film 'Elf.' Sincere thanks to all members of the Village Hall committee, and the army of

lage Hall committee, and the army of brilliant volunteers who are working extremely hard to keep the Village Hall vibrant and viable.

Keyingham Primary School 'Green Space' Project

The Green spaces Project 2023/24 is off to a great start this term with 12 experienced Student Councillors continuing the 'Green Theme' with 'Forest Gardening.' Forest Gardening can best be described as a carefully managed scheme of underplanting existing Trees with flowers, shrubs herbs and vegetables. Supported by the Parish Council, Keyingham Allotment Holders and friends and families The School Council are on the lookout for any spare plants you may have such as lavender, herbs of any kind, beans, peas, tomatoes, raspberries, strawberries, to plant after the last frosts to create a miniature garden under the canopy of trees at the back of the school where they can tend them and watch them flourish throughout the growing season. If you think you may have spare plants or would like to get involved, please contact Mrs Richardson, School Manager.

Cemetery

The Rabbit-Proof fencing seems to be working and work is underway to protect the area above the electrical supply cable running beside the path beyond the Garden of Remembrance. Works will be car-

ried out sensitively taking into account burials and graveside memorials.

Remembrance Sunday

A service of remembrance will take place in St Nicholas Church at 10.00am on 12th November 2023, followed by the observation of 2 minutes silence, dedication and wreath-laying in the Church Grounds. Refreshments will be available afterwards in the Church and wreathes will be transferred to the War Memorial after the Service. Representatives of uniformed groups and Services and the Royal British Legion will be in attendance and everyone is most welcome to join in this service of remembrance.
