Parish Council 'Round-up' November 2023 - January 2024

Happy New Year! Planning & Development

At the end of 2023 the Parish Council were informed that following a visit to the site by enforcement officers planning permission for development of at the site of Mt Airey farm had been refused. The reasons for this included risk assessments safe removal, transportation and disposal of asbestos and consideration of the protection of Bats and their habitats. The After several postponements the 3 Parish Council have contacted the Case Officer directly to asking to view the risk assessments and be kept informed of the findings of enforcement officers as they make their visits installed soon. and subsequent recommendations.

Road Safety in Keyingham

At The November meeting of the Parish Council Cllr Sean McMaster was joined by representatives of the Traffic Management and Capital Projects teams to provide direct feedback on the issues impeding the progress of works to improve the road crossing and the siting of safety signage. Within 36 hours of the meeting the road safety sign, which had been approved by ERYC and Keyingham PC to replace the original 'Spare our Children' sign, was installed to the west of the village.

Officers explained to the Parish Council that several of the potential improvements to the crossing originally discussed and agreed had proved unworkable as the road and

pavements at this point are too narrow and buildings on either side of the road too close together.

A site meeting to consider the options for any potential improvements is due to take place in the last week of January or first week in February.
