Parish Council 'Round-up' June -July 2023

Planning & Development

During June and July the Parish Council received a very large amount of public engagement regarding the proposal to build 20 dwellings on Church Lane. At the June meeting over 70 members of the public attended to raise concerns about the proposal and over 100 more people had written individually to ERYC Planning Department.

All three ERYC Ward Councillors, Lyn Healing, Claire Holmes and Sean McMaster were present at the meeting to listen to residents' concerns and to respond to questions regarding the proposal, providing advice on the planning process and pledging their support to ensure that all the issues raised were brought to the attention of the ERYC Planning Committee when it meets to consider the proposal.

Ward Councillors explained that it was very important that everyone who wished to express a view in relation to this proposal should do so via the ERYC Planning Portal

via email to the Planning Department or by post.

Cllr Holmes explained that everyone entitled to vote had a right to express an individual view and should be encouraged to do so, as this informed the work of the planning committee, enabling them to understand the local perspective in each instance.

Parish Councillors listened carefully to each of the points raised before discussing the proposal and taking a vote. Taking into account the issues raised by the public and considering the proposal from each perspective the Parish Council voted unanimously to oppose the proposal. A date for the meeting of the Planning Committee to consider the proposal has not yet been set, however it is likely to take place in the Autumn.

Road Safety in Keyingham

Despite the help and support of our Ward Councillors progress towards the work to redesign the road crossing at the centre of the village appears to be stalled. Cllr Sean McMaster has pledged support to continue to press the relevant departments for updates.

Antisocial Behaviour on the Village Green/CCTV

At the June meeting the Council received confirmation from ERYC that the installation of CCTV in the area if the Village Green, Saltaugh Road Amenity Area and Main Street would begin late August and should be complete by mid- September. As previously explained the monitoring of the Cameras will be the responsibility of ERYC and they will have ownership of data gathered. Once the cameras are up and working it will be possible for ERYC monitoring staff to provide recordings of antisocial behaviour directly to Humber-

side Police for action. The Council have recently been issued with names and catchment areas of each of the Anti-social Behaviour Officers – who can be contacted directly. The officers names, contact details and a map showing each of the 'zones' can be found on the PC website on the Home Page under "External Links"

Keyingham Village Hall

The Parish Council continues to support the efforts of the Village Hall Committee to stimulate use and engagement for the Village Hall.

Utilising the grant funding which the Parish Council received it has been possible to update the heating system, make some essential repairs repaint the exterior and hold events including subsidised film nights to help boost usage. At the June meeting of the Parish Council, Village Hall Chairman Cllr Mark Ward reported on the tremendous success of the Wednesday coffee mornings, thanking all the volunteers involved in these highly successful events for their hard work in supporting the continued viability of the Hall. The next stage in the project will be to install new heating controls using Wi-Fi, to increase efficiency and help reduce heating costs.

The Village Hall committee have decide to run Film Shows in the Hall during the Autumn and Winter period. Keep and eye on posters around the village and on the Parish Website for details.

Keyingham Primary School 'Green Space' Project. The bench has arrived!

The colourful bench, chosen by the Keyingham Primary School Student Council Members to be placed in the 'Green Space' in front of the School on the corner of Russell Drive and Saltaugh Road has been delivered and will soon be placed in its permanent position. The photograph on page 4 shows members of the Student Council selecting a site for the bench. A Big Thank You to those of you who pledged time and materials to help with the concrete base for the bench.

Cemetery

The Rabbit-Proof (well we certainly hope it is...) fencing is now in place and summer planting of the troughs is almost completed. During the works an electrical cable was discovered to be running through a section of the cemetery. The area in question is, as yet, unused for burials and may not be required for some time, however it is likely that the cable may need to be re-marked, protected by extending the path, or re-routed. A site survey has been carried out by National Power Grid and we are awaiting their recommendations.

Following the election 2 vacancies remain on the Parish Council, which may now be filled by co-option. Anyone who may be interested in becoming a councillor please contact the Parish Clerk.
