Road Safety in Keyingham

Following the election, at the parish Council's request, ERYC Councillor Claire Holmes will be in attendance at the June meeting of the Parish Council and has asked to bring along a representative of the ERYC Traffic Management Team to provide a long overdue update on the proposed timescale for the completing of works at the road crossing and along the A1033. Public participation is most welcome.

Antisocial Behaviour on the Village Green/CCTV

At the May meeting the PC members were pleased to receive the news that the funds to purchase and site CCTV to address antisocial behaviour in three specific areas of the village has been received into the Parish Council bank account. The next stage in this process will be the placing of cameras in the area if the Village Green, Saltaugh Road Amenity Area and Main Street. The monitoring of the Cameras will be the responsibility of ERYC and they will have ownership of data gathered. Once the cameras are up and working it will be possible for ERYC monitoring staff to provide recordings of antisocial behaviour directly to Humberside Police for action.

Keyingham Village Hall

The Parish Council continues to support the efforts of the Village Hall Committee to stimulate use and engagement for the Village Hall. Following receipt of the second tranche of funding, Councillors are working alongside Village Hall Committee members to gather quotes for improvements to the thermostatic controls for the heating system to make the heating 'zoned' more efficient and reduce energy costs.

Keyingham Primary School 'Green Space' Project – The bench is on its way!

The colourful bench, chosen by the Keyingham Primary School Student Council Members to be placed in the 'Green Space' in front of the School on the corner of Russell Drive and Saltaugh Road will soon be delivered. Once on site a concrete base will be created to secure the bench. If anyone would like to donate materials, skills or labour to help create the base please contact Mrs L. Richardson, School Manager or the Parish Clerk. The School Council would like to thank Sunk Island Garden Centre for the donation of over 150 daffodil bulbs which were planted last week in good time for a beautiful display next Spring!

Cemetery

Work on the cemetery fencing to prevent rabbit damage to floral tributes and planting was delayed due to extremely wet conditions to avoid causing damage to the lawned areas of the cemetery. The work will be completed as soon as the ground is firm enough for machinery to pass over it without. All normal services will continue throughout the work which will be carried out as sensitively as possible.

Allotments

The Council are very pleased to note that allotment gardening continues to be a popular and rewarding pastime and that almost all the available plots are now taken. A couple of small areas are still available for let and anyone interested should contact the Parish Clerk or Cllr Ray Lawton.

The Council is also considering its future policy/position in relation to the use of chemical controls and would be pleased to hear from current allotment holders in Keyingham who would like to share their views. Allotment holders can email the Parish Clerk or share views in person by attending a Council meeting.
