Min.2349 Subcommittees

1. Playing fields. A further request was made to write to ERYC and again invite the officers to meet with the councillors to discuss the water leakage from the school playingfield on to the field. Members felt that the responses from ERYC are unsatisfactory Clerk to write again. Following a request from a resident who wishes to use the football pitch on Thursday evenings from 6pm-7pm for training 12 boys to develop football skills and fitness. Discussion took place and it was agreed that as it was for youngsters there would be no charge.

Another request to set up a "Boot Camp" on the Field was discussed and Members felt that a trial period with no rent until December was proposed. The two instructors are fully qualified and will be insured once permission is given.

Eastfield Rd . Still waiting for equipment to be painted. Playing field inspection sheets handed in.

The Garth. No Problems

.2. Allotments. The three allotment tenants who were sent "signed for" letters have not responded. The deadline before eviction is 23rd October.

3 Churchyard. No Problems

4. War Memorial. Litter accumulated in that area.

5.. Cemetery. Plants have been purchased and the tubs will be replenished soon.

A request from W.P Everingham (Stonemason) was made on behalf of a resident who wished to have a Cremation Tablet placed in the Cemetery which is a new design and has different dimensions to the usual designs. After debate it was felt that to change now would set a precedent and other relatives may want to join the bandwagon. Chairman asked for a vote to be taken.

Cllr J Lee proposed leaving the regulations as they stand, Seconded by Cllr R Lawton. 7 voted in favour and 6 voted against. Motion carried. Clerk will inform Everingham's of the decision.

.6 Streets & Verges. Trees are overhanging the footpath near the junction with Eastfield Rd and Ottringham Rd.

The village is looking very dirty with litter. The Brook Street Agency have been instructed to replace Mrs Mills as a matter of urgency.

.7... Boyes Lane. Cllr .Lee announced that he is seeking prices for roofing the decking area and erecting a larger kissing gate to enable access for wheelchairs etc. The project will cost approx. £10,000. To install electricity will cost around £23,000 and £23,000 to tarmac the road.

It is hoped that funding from the Big Lottery will be successful.

Min.2350... Village Plan. Cllr Haxby gave an update on village plan news. The new dog fouling signs are to hand and arrangements are being sought to fix them. However if they are on private property e.g walls, a letter of permission must be signed.

Re-planting of brick planter under village signs are to be moved to a more permanent planting with ground cover, due to a problem with weeds.

A donation has been received to purchase a Blue Plaque

Min.2351.. Councillors Forum. Cllr Thompson reminded that some time ago the council agreed to gather the names of village service personnel who fought in the war and had returned home. This will be deferred until a later date
