Regulations for making of an award.

- 1. The Trustees of the Marritt and Ombler Foundation can, as far as the finances will allow, make an award to persons under the age of 25 years who have been educated in Keyingham or in the High School, which the children from Keyingham attend. The applicant's permanent address or that of his/her parents/guardians should be in the electoral Parish of Keyingham at the time s/he wishes to attend the course/activity for which the grant has been requested.
- 2. Awards can be made to promote in such ways the Trustees think fit the education, including social and physical training, to persons meeting the above criteria, who are in need of financial assistance. Any award made will be at the discretion of the trustees taking into account the means, application and dedication of the person involved in achieving full benefit from the course/activity for which the grant has been awarded.
- 3. During the term of the award, the Trustees may contact the person in charge of the course/activity to ensure that the student/participant is achieving his/her potential. The Trustees may, at their absolute discretion, withdraw an award if they are not satisfied with the report received.
- 4. To be eligible for an award the applicant must:
 - a) Be accepted by the body responsible for the organisation and administration of the course/activity.
 - b) Satisfy the trustees that there will be financial difficulty in meeting costs and expenses arising from attendance on the course/activity.
 - c) Satisfy the trustees as to his/ her character and furnish any references or information required.
 - d) Attend an interview if required to do so.
- 5. The trustees will take into account the cost of the course/activity, means of support available, or any other relevant factor in determining the value of an award.
- 6. Assistance can be given towards the cost of clothing applicable to a course/activity, tools, instruments or books. Details of the same and an itemised list with receipts of how the award has been spent will be required no later than one year after the award has been made.
- 7. Awards may be made to enable persons to travel in this country or abroad to pursue their education.
- 8. Awards can be made to schools within the electoral Parish of Keyingham or substantially serving the same for any such materials not normally provided by the education authority.
- Applications for awards will be considered at the meetings of the trustees and not separately by any individual trustee or trustees.
- 10. The trustees shall be entitled to withhold awards in any year if in their opinion there are no suitable applicants.
- 11. Applications must be made to the secretary of the foundation prior to the meetings, which are held in early March and October of each year.
